Each year, Opportunities Unlimited's "Gotta Brain Getta Helmet" program donates helmets to Sioux City second graders. In addition to providing students with helmets, we partner with local educators to provide valuable brain injury prevention curriculum that



highlights the importance of bicycle safety and wearing protective equipment. On average, OU has distributed

average, OU has distributed approximately 300 helmets each year. However, with the support of grant funding from local organizations, including DQ, we are able to provide every second and third grader in the Sioux City School District a helmet this year! While the Covid-19 virus has prevented us from leading the school assemblies in person this year, everyone has adapted well to our virtual assemblies. It has been terrific to be able to promote awareness and prevention to a group of students who eagerly take part in this initiative!
