Individuals meeting requirements must have had at least 500 hours of currently verifiable direct contact experience with persons who have sustained a brain injury. The ACBIS Alliance provides public recognition to a brain injury service provider, or designated facility, that has achieved the benchmark of having at least 20% of its staff who are eligible for national certification certified as a CBIS or CBIST. Currently, Opportunities Unlimited is the first and only site in the Midwest to become certified by ACBIS!

Apple TV allows the therapist to mirror what is on their iPad to the TV so everyone in the room is able to see what applications is running, class material, photos, or videos.

This device will expand our abilities to use our iPads in a group setting to assist with person serves visual needs, and create a modeling method for teaching the people we serve how to navigate their iPad by watching it on the TV. It will also assist with completing tasks in a group setting to create an interactive group therapy setting during treatment.
