OU Awarded Three-Year Accreditation



CARF International announced that Opportunities Unlimited has been accredited for a period of three years for the following programs:

- Residential Rehabilitation Programs: Brain Injury Specialty Program (Adults)
- Vocational Services: Brain Injury Specialty Program (Adults)
- Child and Youth Services
- Community Integration
- Home and Community Services
- Organizational Employment Services
- Respite Services
- Supported Living

This accreditation decision represents the highest level of accreditation that can be awarded to an organization and shows the organization's substantial conformance to the CARF standards. This represents the 6th consecutive three-year accreditation that OU has achieved. An organization receiving a Three-Year Accreditation has put itself through a rigorous peer review process and has demonstrated to a team of surveyors during an onsite visit that its programs and services are of the highest quality, measurable, and accountable.

CARF is an independent, nonprofit accrediting body whose mission is to promote the quality, value, and optimal outcomes of services through a consultative accreditation process that centers on enhancing the lives of the persons served. Founded in 1966 as the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities, and now known as CARF, the accrediting body establishes person served focused standards to help organizations measure and improve the quality of their programs and services.
